During the 2023-24 school year, our district continued to do whole grade sharing with North Kossuth. Elementary students (PreK-5) are at Sentral while middle school students (6-8) attended North Kossuth. North Kossuth district sent their high school students to North Union High School. The two districts also share all athletic programs. Combined enrollment is approximately 700 students PK-12.

The North Union School District is a high achieving academic institution with outstanding district and community support. The students enrolled at the North Union High School experience the benefits of a 1:1 Chromebook learning environment. We believe that technology is an effective tool that aids in the successful facilitation of the learning process. We actively engage students in project based and academically challenging experiences on a daily basis.
